Financial FYI

Our figures show that an **average income of \$1,800 per week** is necessary to balance the Budget. Income from tithes and offerings in 2024 to date totals **\$25,464**, which averages out to **\$1,498** per week. Thank you for your continuing support!



We have been very busy throughout the month of April. As of April 25, we served 2,294 breakfasts for an average 143 per day and 2,751 lunches for an average of 172 per day. We served 556 individual people meals throughout the month of April. This included children as well as adults. During vacation week we saw many families with young children coming through our doors. We are seeking stuffed animals to give out to our children. A stuffed animal can mean a lot to a child who is homeless.

We continue to need items for our clothing section for both men and women, blankets, and underwear. We understand that folks will soon be left out of the hotels/motels, the date the state is talking about is June 30, and we will be in need of tarps, tents, and sleeping bags.

As of the beginning of April we learned that there were 645 individuals living in the hotels/motels in Rutland and 154 of them were children.

Our pantry is extremely bare right now. There is a list of items that are needed in this newsletter.

This month we are partnering with Jones' Donuts to have a fundraiser. The donuts are \$20.00 a dozen. You can order either a dozen Maple Glazed, a dozen Boston Crème or ½ dozen of each. See the flyer to scan and pay through Pay Pal or call the Rutland United Methodist Church at 802-773-2460 to place your order. All orders need to be ordered and prepaid by May 9. Pick up is May 18 at the United Methodist Church, 60 Strongs Ave. between 10-12am. We want to express our gratitude for all of you who donate your time, items and money to help us Feed and Care for Our Neighbors. We are still in need of volunteers anytime from 6:30-1:00, Monday through Thursday. We have many different jobs and can always use assistance with a variety of things that need to be done. If you have a hobby you would like to share with our neighbors, please let Ellie or Linda know. We are hoping to have various individuals from our community come in and share a hobby. We are already building Legos, playing games, coloring, putting a puzzle together and painting rocks. Or if you just want to come in and visit, we would like to have folks who can circulate among our neighbors and form relationships. Making those connections means a lot to our neighbors. One never knows the impact you can have on someone's life when you share a part of yourself to help another person who is struggling in our community.

We still have \$222,000 to raise until December 31 to meet our budget. We will do this through donations, grants, and fundraisers. If you have a fundraising idea, please send it our way.

We are already starting to prepare for this year's Holiday Fest in October. This year it is going to be a Chocolate Fest. This will be held at Grace Church on October 12 from 10-2. We need assistance seeking donations of chocolate for tastings, items for our silent auction and more hands to help with organization and implementation. If you can assist us, please contact Ellie at 802-236-3136. Any assistance will be greatly appreciated. To date this has been our largest fundraiser each year.


MUSIC NOTES AND WORSHIP TEAM
