Message from Pastor John

I enjoy words and playing with words. Often times they reveal meanings I did not at first see. Take "thanksgiving," for instance, a timely word for this month of Thanksgiving. The holiday may be the first meaning that comes to mind at this time of year. How we might celebrate that holiday is food for thought. To do so could make it much more meaningful and heartfelt this year.

But back to our initial word, "thanksgiving." If we go to the Oxford dictionary, we find a definition that says, "the expression of gratitude, especially to God." I like that word gratitude. It has feeling to it, good feeling. And it is a good way to live, to be attentive to life and the wonder of it all. There is so much to be thankful for when we do. Considering the source of it all can deepen our gratitude all the more.

The etymology of words is often revealing too, providing historical derivation and nuancing meaning. The word "thanksgiving" comes down to us from an Old English noun meaning "grateful thought" and verb meaning "to bestow or grant." Thoughtfulness, reflectiveness - they enrich not only our understanding, but often our felt gratitude, especially for loved ones here and for others gone. Maybe such grateful thoughtfulness will prompt us to reach out to someone and say so. Our delight and theirs awaits. But such reflection can also be difficult, when the memories evoked come with painful emotions attached to them. Even then, gratitude can often be found, at least in being a survivor.

Thanksgiving. Thanks. Giving. Giving thanks. Reflecting on Thanksgivings past, and how and to whom we might express our gratitude this Thanksgiving. Being a thankful person. Giving, as a way of life, so others have reason to be thankful and gratitude multiplied and life all the more blessed. Giving thanks - to one another and to God, who has bestowed this gift of life in all its wonder, beauty, intricacy and mystery.
