Considering all the times we have been sick in the course of our lives, yet, here we are, some people would say, "Yes, God heals." 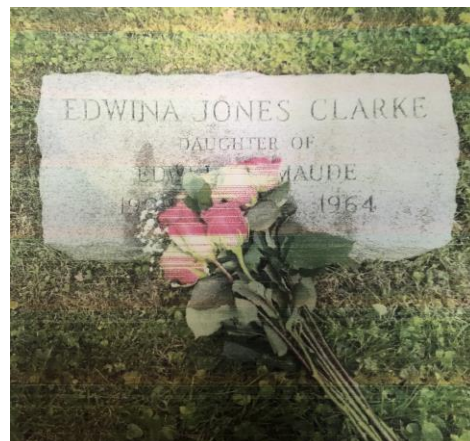

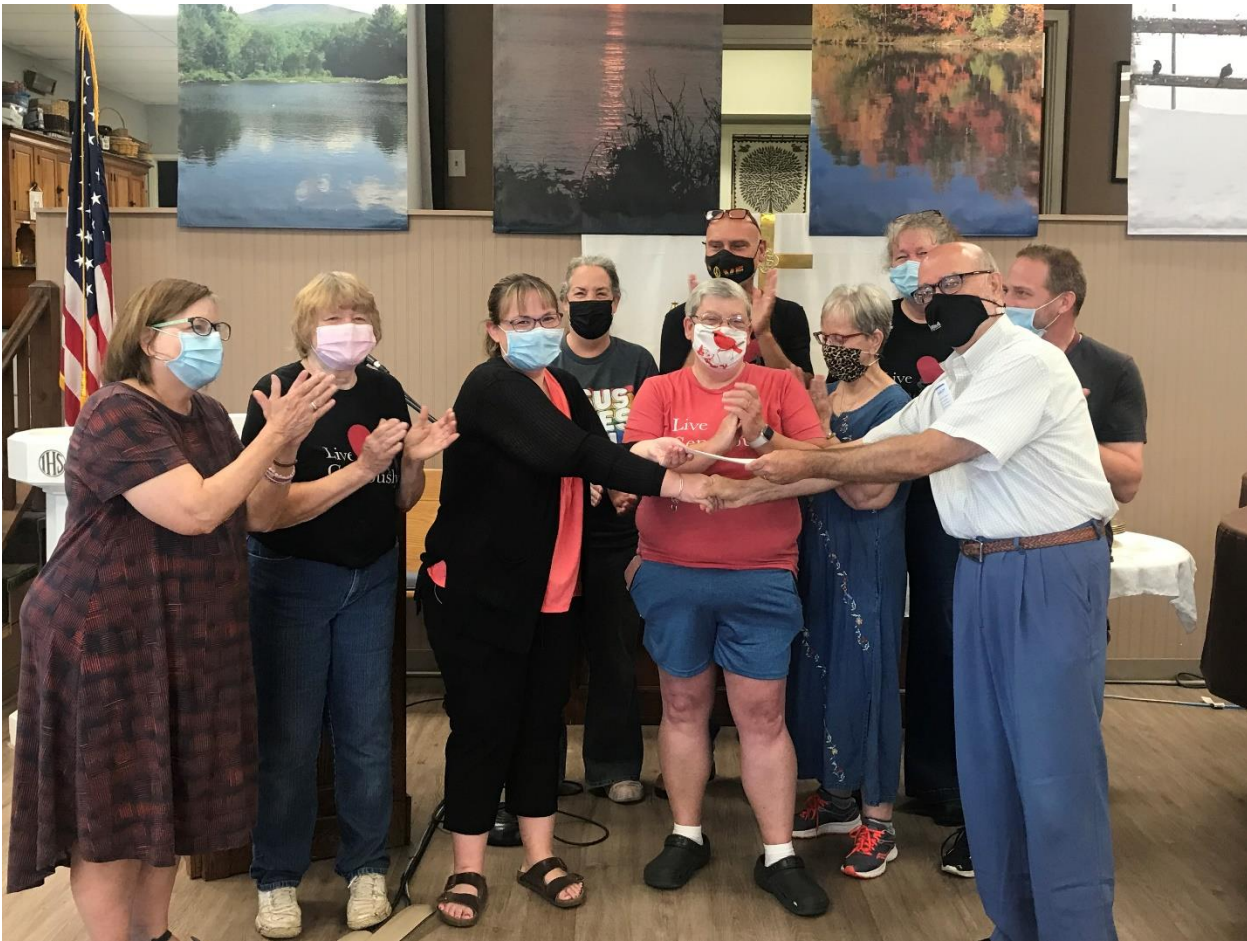
Companions in Wholeness

Companions in Wholeness continues to be busy. We served 2,813 breakfasts and 2,205 lunches in August. We had 107 individuals access our food pantry. On August 3, we had a visit from Tom Andrew, a representative from the United Methodist Foundation Grant Committee, who presented us with a \$5,000 check. He observed the great work being done and was very impressed. (See photo below.) CIW Coordinator, Ellie McGarry, continues to seek out grant funding and other donations. We received word that we were awarded a \$7,500 from the Hills and Hollows Fund at the VT Community Foundation and \$2,000 from the Ben & Jerry's Foundation. We received a wonderful donation of 540 pairs of new socks from Darn Tough Socks out of Norwich, VT.
