The doors open at about 7:00 a.m. Visitors sign in, grab a cup of coffee, and enjoy fellowship with each other and our volunteers until serving begins at 9 a.m. This gets back to the heart of what Companions In Wholeness intended – making connection with those in our community.

While it seems so long ago, we want to give many thanks to all involved with Holiday Fair & Silent Auction. Thanks to all of you, we netted \$6,127.89. We look forward to making this an annual event. We recently received a generous \$7,000 gift from Carris Reels.

Sunday School


